Since 1690 the heart of the early industrial community at Historic RittenhouseTown has remained the early Mill. Today the Mill Site and adjacent 1707 Homestead and circa 1720 Bake House remind us all of the importance of the paper making industry to the development of early America and the essential role of the Rittenhouse family as suppliers of locally produced paper for letters, legal documents, maps and books.
